Types of records that are most often accessed:

- Census
- Court (Federal)
- Immigration
- Land
- Naturalization
- Military

Some of these records exist on FindMyPast.com and MyHeritage.com. Links that appear on the site are for Ancestry Institution version of the software (access at a local library). From home, use the title in the search engine or the Ancestry or FamilySearch catalogs.
